Trauma-Informed Concealed Pregnancy Pathway

If pregnancy is suspected, enquire sensitively if child/ adult may be pregnant. If disclosure made about concealment of pregnancy, take a supportive view of why pregnancy has been concealed or denied.

immediate actions

- Contact Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH)
- Complete <u>Multi Agency Referral Form</u> (MARF)
- Seek advice and support from <u>relevant Safeguarding Lead</u> (NHS)
- Child protection concerns/ immediate concern of harm Children's Social Care to notify Police
- <u>Medical assessment and consent</u>_Consider <u>Gillick Competence and</u> <u>Fraser Guidelines</u> and MCA if appropriate
- Does person have capacity to make decisions about the pregnancy?
 Seek advice from Named Professional for Safeguarding Adults and MCA
- Best Interest decisions if no capacity
- Referral to Perinatal Mental Health Service if needed
- Support to use 0-19s services

Be non-judgmental/ non-directive of reasons behind concealment Be mindful of cultural and religious factors (e.g. family honour)

Be aware of possible traumatic experiences and/or adverse childhood experiences:

- Being abused (physical, sexual and verbal), coercive control and/or emotional and physical neglect
- Being in/ growing up in households where there is substance abuse, mental health difficulties, domestic violence, parental separation, adult who has been in prison
- Experience of previous miscarriage or stillbirth, death of a baby or child
- Self-harm, bullying, poverty, living in a deprived neighbourhood, anti-social and violent behaviour, fear of having child removed by Social Services

next steps and things to consider

- Convene multi-agency meeting/ strategy discussion
- Refer to GP for antenatal care booking, MKUH midwifery services/named safeguarding midwife
- Pre-Birth Assessment by Children's Social Care/ Pre-Birth procedures
- Are the child's parents/guardians aware of the pregnancy?
- Is this a missing child?
- Is there a risk of <u>exploitation</u> / <u>modern slavery?</u>
- Has <u>abuse by children</u> taken place (peer to peer/ sibling abuse)?

Support referral to GP and MK Maternity Service, if safeguarding concerns:

- Contact <u>Adult Safeguarding Team</u> and MASH
- Seek advice and support from <u>relevant Safeguarding Lead</u>
- Complete Multi Agency Referral Form (MARF)
- Pre-birth assessment (see next steps for child)
- If an appointment for antenatal care is made beyond 12 weeks, explore why, and if concerns, refer to MASH & Named safeguarding midwife.
- If mother presents in labour: urgent referral to MASH and safeguarding team
- If mother abandons child: contact Police and initiate safeguarding procedures

Agencies and teams who will/ may need to be involved:

MASH, MKUFT, CNWL, MK Together, Emergency Duty Team, MK ACT domestic abuse services, MK Young Persons or Adults Drug & Alcohol services, CAMHS, Perinatal services, School nursing, school mental health and pastoral support, sexual health services, Police, health visiting, social housing
