

# Milton Keynes Safeguarding Competency Framework: at-a-glance summary

This summary provides a quick reference guide to the five safeguarding competency levels for professionals working with children and adults across Milton Keynes Together Safeguarding Partnership. This document complements the full MKTSP Competency Framework and supports staff in identifying their training needs and responsibilities.

# Level 1 – Basic Awareness

**Audience:** All staff with incidental contact (eq admin, reception, volunteers)

# Children:

- Recognise signs of abuse (CSE, FGM, neglect)
- Understand Early Help and reporting procedures
- Know what to do if a child discloses abuse

#### Adults:

- Recognise indicators of adult abuse and neglect
- Know how to report concerns and seek advice
- Understand consent and information sharing

# **Training:**

- E-learning / face-to-face
- Updates via staff meetings/email
- Frequency: As per agency standards

# Level 2 – Direct Contact Roles

**Audience:** Staff with regular contact (eg carers, youth workers, housing officers)

# Children:

- Identify and refer children at risk (eg trafficking, radicalisation)
- Advocate for children
- Understand contextual safeguarding

## Adults:

- Apply Making Safeguarding Personal
- Refer associated persons (eq carers, children)

Understand coercive control and consent complexities

# **Training:**

- Face-to-face / reflective practice
- Frequency: As per agency standards

# Level 3 – Assessment and Intervention Roles

**Audience:** Professionals assessing and planning care (*eg* social workers, nurses, Designated Safeguarding Leads)

#### Children:

- Conduct safeguarding assessments
- Contribute to multi-agency reviews
- Lead safeguarding discussions and documentation

#### Adults:

- Undertake capacity assessments
- Lead protection planning and risk analysis
- Contribute to Safeguarding Adult Reviews

# Training:

- Inter-agency workshops, conferences
- Learning from case reviews
- Frequency: As per agency standards

# Level 4 – Specialist and Supervisory Roles

Audience: Named professionals, safeguarding leads, managers

# Children:

- Develop safeguarding policy and training
- Lead audits and inspections
- Provide supervision and strategic advice

# Adults:

- Align national guidance to local practice
- Lead investigations and action plans
- Provide strategic safeguarding advice

## Training:

- Designated lead training, inter-agency sessions
- Frequency: As per agency standards

# Level 5 – Strategic Leadership Roles

Audience: Designated professionals, heads of safeguarding

# **Children:**

- Lead strategic safeguarding across agencies
- Influence policy and service development
- Ensure safeguarding is embedded at board level

# Adults:

- Lead safeguarding across health and care systems
- Advise commissioners and boards
- Monitor safeguarding standards and compliance

# **Training:**

- Strategic workshops, multi-agency forums
- Frequency: As per agency standards
